Friends of a paralyzed man, who couldn't reach Jesus, took extraordinary steps to lower the paralyzed man through a hole in a roof so that he could be healed. I try to imagine how hard that would have been for these four friends, not only physically but emotionally to feel the urgency of getting their friend as close to Jesus as possible so that he may experience transformation.

Everyday at New Life, we have people who step in to "carry the mat" for inmates.

One corner is held by chaplains who dedicate their lives to help inmates see the love of Christ. Another corner carried by volunteer instructors who work diligently to write letters for students bringing them closer to Jesus. Another corner carried by our staff who print materials, mark courses, train and lead teams to continue the movement of God in the lives of students. And the last corner carried by our donors and partners who generously provide resources needed to spread the gospel to inmates across Canada.

I am so thankful that I get to serve in a space where God continues to use so many people to reach the lost and broken with the good news of Jesus Christ. LAUNCHING OUR NEW INSTRUCTOR TRAINING

For just over a year, I have had the privilege of working alongside our volunteer instructors across Canada at New Life! I have fallen in love with the mission. I have been so captured by the impact and the stories I hear of lives being transformed and touched by the gospel.

One of my key roles is to train and onboard our new volunteers, and I'm thrilled to announce the launch of our *brand-new training program*!

When I began my role, I quickly realized just how much there was to learn, and that journey is ongoing. My experiences visiting several Canadian prisons and meeting with chaplains, former and current students, incarcerated individuals, social workers, and correctional officers have profoundly challenged and changed me. I have gained insight into the realities faced by inmates, witnessing their pain and suffering and understanding their experiences. I've learned about the conditions they are in when they engage with our courses and letters, allowing me to envision what it feels like to be touched by a message of abundant grace and unconditional love. These experiences have deepened my empathy and inspired me to pray for a perspective that sees them as God does, as loved children with stories of brokenness, worthy of God's grace and redemption. This was the catalyst for the new training launch.

I felt a strong desire for our instructors to experience the same depth of understanding I have gained from interacting with different facets of the Canadian prison system. I wanted them to truly grasp the story of an inmate. My goal was to equip our volunteers with the confidence to reach their students, seeing them through the lens of God's grace. To achieve this, we collaboratively designed our training modules, drawing from insights gathered during institutional visits and feedback from current instructors. Each module addresses key aspects of the prison experience, incorporating real stories and practical strategies to empower our volunteers. This thoughtful approach ensures that our team is not only well-prepared but also deeply connected to the mission of transformation that lies at the heart of our work. This vision has been the driving force behind the launch of our new training program.

We are so glad for the opportunity to share some good news from the Chaplaincy regarding 1st time Baptisms!

September 2024 was monumental for our new and rededicated Christian inmates in first time water baptisms for those who have committed their life to Jesus Christ here at TEDC.

Since baptism is a public display of that commitment, it was so exciting to see each inmate testify before being water baptized of what Jesus had done in their heart. We had approximately 22 baptisms on September 16 and 17th. The testimonies of each inmate was (in a nutshell) heart warming, as many have experienced Jesus for themselves and their desire to walk in the purpose that God has for them.


Some of these inmates were suicidal, depressed, feeling lost and lonely. However, after receiving Jesus and spending time in His Presence, getting to know Jesus through New Life Bible studies, Chapel etc. they began to understand the good plans He has for them. Seeing some of these guys a couple years later, walking with Jesus and the smile of the hope of Who is journeying with them gives them the reason to live for Him. This was their public display of His Presence and His unconditional love for them when everything or everyone else was gone. So many testimonies of these inmates saying they felt "freer in here (prison) than out there". That's God's joy, unconditional love and freedom from the slavery of sin and oppression.


